



GINGERBREAD WOMAN



“A simple and fun design which will be easy to make as a quick project for someone already comfortable with stitching, or for a beginner learning to cross stitch for the first time. This project is ideal for using up scraps of fabric and left over embroidery cotton in your stash and will be a lovely embellishment on a gift bag, stocking, napkin or placed into a frame as a small gift.

Please see the project idea for children which is ‘stitch free’ on the last page.

You will need:

DMC Cotton (6 stranded) in the colours specified in the Key or suitable replacements from your cross stitching stash,

Needle,

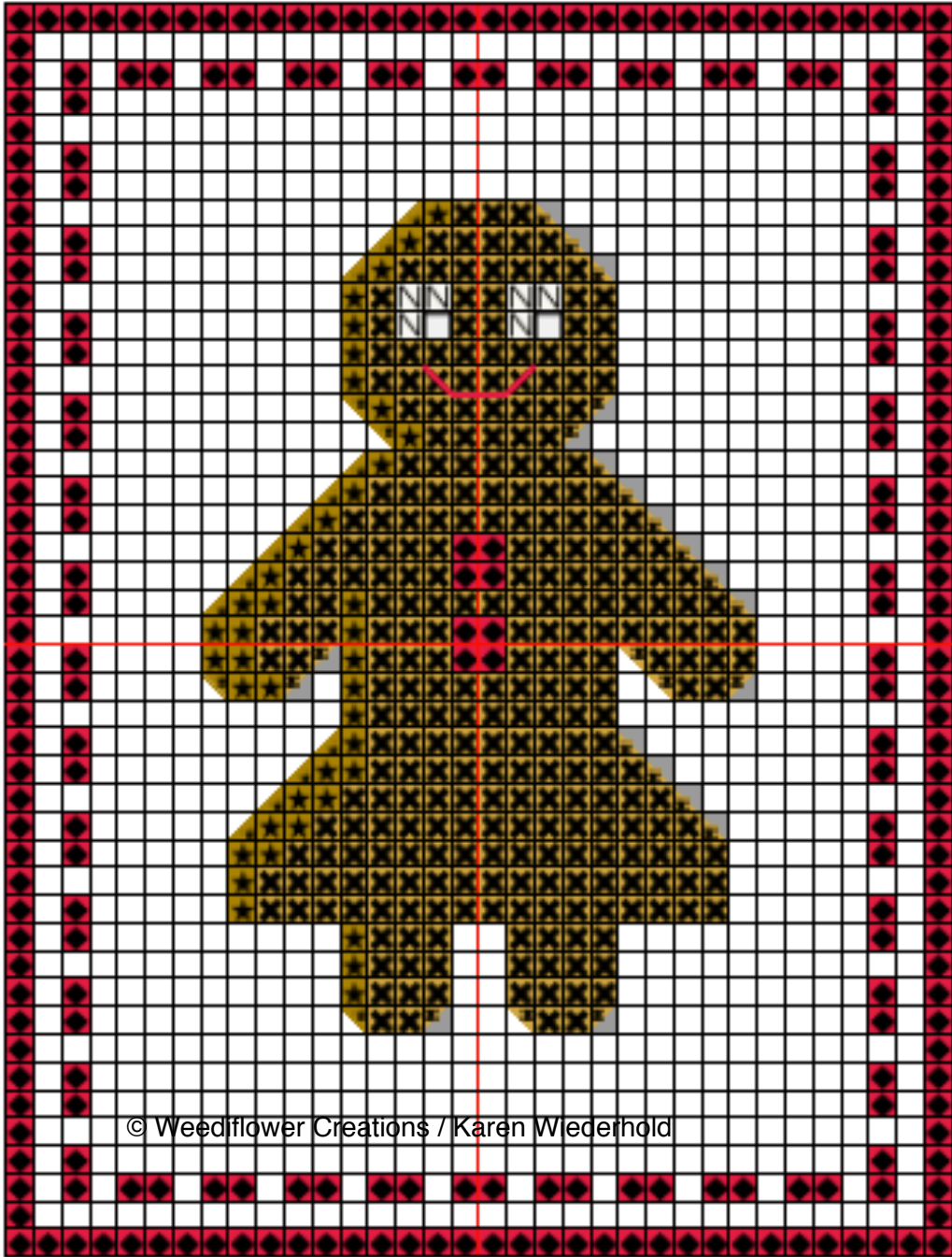
Aida (14 count) or Evenweave (28 count) fabric in white or ivory.

The design size is 35 x 45 stitches when using 14 count fabric, which measures approximately 2.5 x 3.2 inches.

Note:

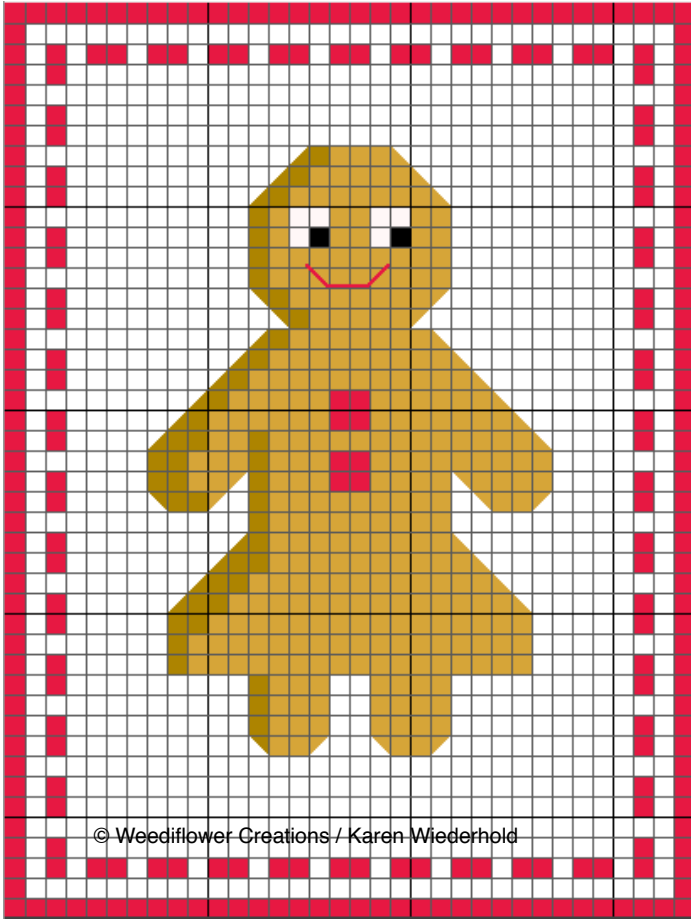
Stitches used are Cross Stitch and Backstitch.

Crosses and Back Stitch are worked in two strands of cotton.

Extra project idea for children:

Hama or Fuse Beads and a large accompanying square peg board make a great alternative for children who would like to recreate all or parts of the design, but who do not stitch. The chart showing coloured blocks without symbols will be easy for them to follow.
